North Shields is known for its historic Fish Quay, maritime heritage, and connection to the fishing industry. It's also known for its role in shipbuilding.

The Old Low Light - the oldest surviving occupied building on North Shields Fish Quay, it stands within

the walls of Clifford's Fort. Dating back to the early 18th century, it guided ships through the Tyne, was an Alms House for poor and sick mariners, then a training base. In 2015, its renovation saw it become heritage centre.

once one of the largest fortified areas in England

Collingwood Monument built in 1845, the Grade

II listed marble and sandstone sculpture by John Graham Lough, tops a pedestal designed by John Dobson.

Travel back in time to the 1950s as you set off on a tour through the Tyne Pedestrian Tunnel and venture across to the North side of the River Tyne.

The Tunnel Vision route takes you on a journey to explore some of North Tyneside's most historic landmarks, Collingwood Monument built in 1845 and Tynemouth Priory & Castle, built in 1095 and was once one of the largest fortified areas in England.
